Research Experience

Environmental Justice:

• USA (2016-2020)-This project involved measuring environmental justice among the black and white population living around the Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson airport area caused by airport noise pollution. The EJ is quantified through the disproportionate exposure to aircraft noise pollution causing health problems to the citizens. This research was funded by a mini grant from the Morehouse Public Health Science Institute.

Sustainability:

- **USA** (2016-present)-This project involves performing a cost-benefit analysis in setting up an Aquaponics system on campus to illustrate the concept of sustainability to the Atlanta University Center specifically, and the West End community at large. This system will also help mitigate the problem of food desert in the West End area. Collaborating with community gardens like Truly Living Well, 3x3 project and the non-profit organization Georgia STAND-UP.
- **Haiti** (2016) Visited Haiti with a group of students on a sustainability service-learning project. This project involved guiding the low-income population in rural Haiti on how to build sanitized toilets. The students also learnt from the community how to best share scarce resources like water, electricity, and food while practicing sustainable living.
- Costa Rica (2006) Visited the country in the Monteverde area with a group of faculties of the ICPSR learning about biodiversity as part of the faculty development seminar. The trip enriched the participants' understanding of living in harmony with Nature and helped them to go back and infuse the concept of sustainability in their curriculums.

Community Revitalization:

- USA (2020-2021) Actively involved with a non-profit organization RCE_ATL in project Drawdown Georgia to revitalize Metro Atlanta area in sectors of Transportation, Electricity, Food & Agriculture, Buildings Materials, and Land Sinks. During this period, while working as visiting faculty at Emory University I was also engaged with a non-profit organization Center for Sustainable Communities, Atlanta as the Assistant Director of Sustainability. Helped to revitalize the communities in Hampton Roads, Virginia through formation of ECO Districts.

This project involved promoting the concept of 'social business' among the village women who were being supported through micro-finance schemes to solve the problem of resource scarcity in their area.

Effectiveness of Credit Pooling Techniques for Infrastructure Development in Rural Communities: A Quasi-Experimental Analysis

The research was to assess the effectiveness of credit pools in enhancing economic development in the rural communities in the southeastern States of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee. It was funded by the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA). It made both an intra- as well as an inter-state comparative study (using the method of quasi-experimentation), of the effectiveness of the credit pooling system by creating four different models. The empirical results indicate that the credit pooling financing technique has some positive impact on the economy by raising the per capita income and income growth in some of the important sectors of the economy.
